

## Sports Premium Funding 2015-2016

At Braywick Court School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all our children.

The government has provided additional funding of over £450 million in the last few years to improve physical education. Our Primary School Sport's funding has enabled us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports coaches during PE sessions, contributing to the range of After School clubs provided, such as Ballet, Football and Athletics, as well as training our staff to deliver high quality PE and Games sessions.

### What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and the money goes directly to primary school Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8,000 plus an extra £5 per pupil (Year 1 – Year 6) each year – at Braywick Court School that is around £8, 150 a year.

### Purpose of the funding

Schools have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they have the freedom to choose how they do this.

### How Braywick Court are using the funding in 2015-16:

- Provide children with PE instruction and coaching from experts
- Develop staff expertise in teaching the PE curriculum through specialist training
- Increase participation in extra-curricular clubs
- We release staff and pay coaches to attend a wide range of events in all areas of the PE curriculum
- We buy high quality materials and equipment to support learning in PE and games
- We provide a range of opportunities for enrichment activities after school and at lunchtime
- We are completing a Yoga and Mindfulness initiative to increase pupils' daily physical exercise and improve their energy, concentration and motivation in the classroom.

### How the funding has been spent in 2015-16

Money spent	Purpose of spending	Impact on children
£2,600	Sports Partnership membership	Access to dance teacher and multi sport coach who give a series of high quality lessons. Offered training to PE teachers in order for them to deliver exceptional lessons. Enabled involvement in local dance festival so that the school becomes more a part of the community.

£304	Bought Val Sabin Schemes of work Key Stage 1 gym , dance, athletics and games	As we did not have a scheme of work in place this offers the children structured PE lessons based on the Val Sabin method of teaching.
£798	Cover for staff to attend CPD	Courses teach staff how to implement new schemes, including Real PE into our schools PE scheme. Real PE aims to give all children the physical literacy, emotional and thinking skills to achieve in PE, sport and life.
£844	Sports kits	Allow children to have a school team kit for when they are representing the school in competitive matches
£900	Yoga and mindfulness - CPD for staff and package for children	Increase pupils' daily physical exercise and improve their energy, concentration and motivation in the classroom.
£540	Sports hall hire - Magnet leisure centre. £90 per hour for 6 weeks	Will allow children the opportunity to take part in sports activities in a large sports hall environment which is not currently available as part of the school.
£1,950	Sports coaches/play leaders to support purposeful play and sports activities at lunchtimes	Ensures that lunchtimes include a range of sporting opportunities for the children.
£844	Purchasing new PE equipment	Give children a range of high quality equipment to enhance their sports development and PE opportunities both indoor and outdoor.
£240	4 children to attend soccer school	Paid for 4 of our gifted footballers to attend a week's soccer school in school holidays to improve their skills and motivation to improve in the sport.
