### **Sports Premium Funding 2019-2020**

At Braywick Court School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement all our children.

The government has provided additional funding of over £450 million in the last few years to improve physical education. Our Primary School Sport's funding has enabled us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports coaches during PE sessions, contributing to the range of After School clubs provided, such as Ballet, Football and Athletics, as well as training our staff to deliver high quality PE and Games sessions.

#### What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and the money goes directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

#### Purpose of the funding

The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

#### Impact of Funding:

Investment in talented, qualified, full time sports coach has enabled the school to meet its vision of raising the profile of PE and improving the overall health and wellbeing for all children. The funding has significantly benefitted the further development of the Sports Coach allowing CPD specifically in Dance and inclusion. Due to COVID 19 participation in external competitions was limited and numbers reduced from 114 children in 18/19 to 66 children in 19/20. However we are proud of what has been achieved in a very challenging year. We established Squad training for children at all levels across both KS1 and KS2. We introduced a Sport Leader Programme for Y4 and Y5 children. The Gymnastic equipment purchased enabled us to deliver high quality gymnastic lessons and after school clubs. We also entered our very first gymnastic competition. The school will continue to build on the participation undertaken in 2019-20 by organising more inter and intra-school competitions for all pupils across a variety of sports, further enabled by the appointment of the new Assistant Sports Coach.

Children who are gifted and talented are identified and parents are sign-posted to external clubs in the borough with most taking up opportunities.

#### **Swimming**

During this academic year the swimming programme has been significantly impacted by COVID 19. Our plan was for all children at Braywick Court School have six swimming lessons each academic year from EYFS upwards and their progress it tracked by the school.

Braywick Court School will publish data for achievement in swimming for Year 6 pupils in 2021 when our first cohort of children will reach Year 6. Unfortunately due to closure we could not offer swimming to EYFS and Y1 children. The swimming programme will resume in 20/21.
