

Sports Premium Funding 2020-2021

At Braywick Court School we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. We believe that an innovative, varied PE curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement all our children.

The government has provided additional funding of over £450 million in the last few years to improve physical education. Our Primary School Sport's funding has enabled us to continue and extend our provision through employing additional sports coaches during PE sessions, contributing to the range of After School clubs provided a wide range which include Dance and Gymnastics to Invictus games which introduce Paralympic sports.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government is providing funding of £150 million per annum. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and the money goes directly to primary school Head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

Purpose of the funding:

The premium must be used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of primary-aged pupils to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

Impact of Funding:

Investment in talented, qualified, full time sports coach has enabled the school to meet its vision of raising the profile of PE and improving the overall health and wellbeing for all children. The funding has significantly benefitted the further development of the Sports Coach allowing CPD specifically in Dance and inclusion. Due to COVID 19 participation in external competitions was none due to the Ascot and Maidenhead School Sports Partnership taking the decision to run virtual competitions throughout the year. It is hoped that by the June 21st restrictions will be lifted and we will be able to start some small-scale fixtures with other local schools. As a replacement for the face-to-face competitions the Ascot and Maidenhead Partnership ran virtual competitions instead. We are very proud of our achievements in what has been a very challenging year. Every pupil in the school has taken part in multi-pool virtual competitions. The emphasis of which has been focused on the school games values and achieving individual personal bests. We also re-established Squad training for children at all levels across both KS1 and KS2. We reintroduced a Sport Leader Programme for Y4 and Y5 children and expanded it to have playleaders in all year groups. As a school we have managed to successfully partner with a local hockey club

(Windsor Hockey) enabling us to expand the sports we offer here at Braywick. The school will continue to maintain and grow our overall participation levels and breadth of sports offered to our children. We have a new assistant sports coach in post, enabling us to take our KS2 pupils to the local leisure centre and use their excellent facilities for all their PE lessons.

In addition to our curriculum lessons we have successfully managed to maintain activity levels for all our children throughout the school year with the introduction of Saturday sports during lockdown as well as hosting virtual clubs during the pandemic. As a school we are extremely proud of all our active programmes and the commitment shown from all members of our school community.

Swimming

Unfortunately, during this academic year our swimming programme has been significantly impacted by COVID 19. We have been unable to offer any swimming lessons to our children this academic year. Our plan was for all children to have a minimum of six swimming lessons each academic year. These lessons commence in EYFS and continue from year 1 – year 6. We have robust data which has tracked the children’s progress to date pre-COVID. It was our intention to be able to publish data to evidence the achievement in swimming for Year 6 children July 2021. However, currently swimming pools in our borough remain closed to schools. As soon as they re-open we will re-commence our swimming programme and endeavour to give as many children as possible the opportunity to take part in weekly swimming lessons.
