Schools Covid-19 Operational Guidance (latest update 27th August 2021) stated:

"The government continues to manage the risk of serious illness from the spread of the virus. Step 4 marked a new phase in the government's response to the pandemic, moving away from stringent restrictions on everyone's day-to-day lives, towards advising people on how to protect themselves and others, alongside targeted interventions to reduce risk.

As COVID-19 becomes a virus that we learn to live with, there is now an imperative to reduce the disruption to children and young people's education - particularly given that the direct clinical risks to children are extremely low, and every adult has been offered a first vaccine and the opportunity for 2 doses by mid-September.

Our priority is to deliver face-to-face, high-quality education to all pupils. The evidence is clear that being out of education causes significant harm to educational attainment, life chances, mental and physical health.

We have worked closely with the Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) and Public Health England (PHE) to revise this guidance.

Not all people with COVID-19 have symptoms. Where appropriate, you should support those who need to self-isolate because they have tested positive to work or learn from home if they are well enough to do so. Schools are required to provide remote education to pupils covered by the direction where their attendance would be contrary to government guidance or legislation around COVID-19.

You should maintain your capacity to deliver high-quality remote education for the next academic year, including for pupils who are abroad, and facing challenges to return due to COVID-19 travel restrictions, for the period they are abroad."

BCS to provide education for key worker and vulnerable pupils.	 Extended schools' team and support staff to facilitate remote learning for key worker and vulnerable pupils 9am-3pm. Remote learning plan (as above) to continue for all pupils and to be accessed by Key Worker and vulnerable pupils in school. Teaching to be delivered in a blended approach with staff using their professional judgement to decide which lessons are best taught live and which lessons are best taught through either pre-recorded or remote means. Every class to have the opportunity to access a zoom call with their teacher and peers at least once a day Mon-Thurs, this can be for a variety of reasons: direct teaching, feedback, wellbeing check in, social time, PSHE, story time, Q&A. Live lesson timetable to be coordinated between key stages to minimise clashes for siblings.
