Pupils will continue to learn how to identify bugs within programs and debug. They will explore abstraction, functions and how to code efficiently. They will also design their own programs for a purpose through the use of child-friendly coding software.

Design and Technology:

WW2 Recipes
Pupils will be investigating what foods were more readily available during World War 2 and why. They will use this information to adapt a recipe using ingredients from that time to design a delicious dish for that time.

Music

Pupils will select songs to sing in a round accompanied by a music composition on glockenspiels. This will culminate in a whole class performance of their composition.

- Blood: how does it travel and dioramas
- Investigating the heart
- Oxygenated and deoxygenated blood
- Dissection of the heart
